PASTOR'S PEN

Then the disciples came and said to him, "Do you know that the Pharisees were offended when they heard this saying?" He answered, "Every plant that my heavenly Father has not planted will be rooted up."

~ St. Matthew 15:11-13 ~

Dear Saints and Friends of Immanuel,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ who is blessed forever. Amen.

The Church is entering the Season of the Church, the Sundays after Pentecost. The readings and propers in the services focus our attention on the life of Christ lived out through His Church, among His people, by the power of the Holy Spirit, which has been being poured out on all flesh since the Day of Pentecost some 2,000 years ago when the apostles sat in the upper room waiting for the Promise from on high.

During the Season of the Church (the Sundays after Trinity) we hear the familiar parables of the Rich Man & Lazarus, the Wedding Feast, the Wedding Guests, the Sower of Seed, and many, many others. These parables of our Lord are given to us that we would hear with ears to hear and see with eyes that are opened to the Kingdom.

So why do some hear and not understand? Why do some see but do not perceive? It is because their hearts are far from Him. Even if they bless Him with their mouths their hearts are far from Him. Never mind the world of unbelievers. It is the unbeliever in our midst of which the Lord speaks when He says, "Well did Isaiah prophecy of hypocrites, as it is written, 'This people honors Me with their lips, but their hearts are far from Me'" (Mark 7:6).

But how would it be that a person is among us and yet their heart is far from the Lord? How could it be that those who go out from us and not among us (1 John 2:19)?

In John 6, after the Bread of Life discourse, many who were disciples of Jesus said, "This saying is too hard for us, who can believe it?" and they departed. The Bible says that they were disciples, yet His words were too hard for them and they left. Jesus turned to the Twelve and said, "Do you want to go too?" To which the Blessed Peter answered, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life!" (see John 6:66-71). Note that Jesus didn't go after those disciples who left. He didn't soften His words or try to explain them in a different way (and even if He did, the Holy Spirit did not think it good to record such for us).

Jesus let them go. They had heard His word, even followed Him, yet when His word became too difficult, they left Him and His apostles.

So it happens today. John 6 is not just a nice chapter of the Bible that fills us with thoughts of the Lord's Supper and the importance of believe on Jesus. It is the life of Jesus that is still lived today in His Church, as the Book of Acts makes clear (cf Acts 1:1-3). It is still the life of Jesus that is lived today – He is risen from the dead! – and it is by the Spirit of God that we participate in His life (cf. 2 Peter 1:4). So His preaching – the preaching of the Spirit – still offends some who seem to be disciples and yet find the sayings too hard and so leave.

What remains for us is to say with Peter, “Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life!” And where are we when the Lord is among us, preaching to us, teaching us, where the Father is pouring out the Spirit through the Son, except in His divine gathering where two or three are gathered? So it is written, “We must pay closer attention to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it” (Hebrews 2:1) and also, “let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near” (Hebrews 10:24-25). We can hardly “stir one another up to good works” if we are not around one another.

The Season of the Church is not *our* season, it is the Lord's Church and so it is His season. It is, however, the season in which the Lord more closely examines us and more closely teaches us what it means to be His disciple. “Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.”

I look forward to seeing all in our Father's house.

BOARD OF PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

- The railings and gutter projects are delayed but still planned for this summer. We could use some more help when it comes time to mount those rails. Volunteering now will speed up the rail project.
- Altar work is set for this summer. The altar and steps may have the carpet removed for a time at some point for investigating the quality and integrity of the wood floor underneath.
- The west undercroft door has been left open three times in the past two weeks (viewed on camera). All three doors into the sanctuary building are fire doors and must be closed when the building is empty. An alarm contact will be scheduled to be added to that door soon to eliminate this issue (the alarm won't arm then if it's open).

In the last month the Board of Property Maintenance has continued to repair items.

- The sanctuary air conditioner received an adjustment after I found that our heating and air company did not change over all the valves correctly in my absence. Andrew Stuewe also helped out by finding a setting for the fellowship hall that was incorrectly set.
- We also seem to have a continued need to replace trash cans outside our back door when others take one, unfortunately we have to pay to replace it! We will probably start locking them up together.
- Microphones have required attention. In the fellowship hall the new cordless microphone just required a new battery. In the sanctuary the amplifier is out for repair. (Thanks Stirling.)
- The main sewer was cleaned out.
- The dishwasher is up and running.
- Several light bulbs have once again needed to be replaced.
- Also a pew kneeler here and there is also always ready for some maintenance.
- The yard crew is beginning its season of maintaining the church yard and Flowers have been planted in the courtyard (Thanks Lisa and David Bromlow.)
- The vestry and sacristy stairwells received a new coat of paint. The stage back wall was painted by the staff of CAW.
- Toilet seats have also been tightened

As you can see it takes all of us to help maintain the facility. THANK YOU ALL! As always if you see something that needs attention please let Rob Smith or the church office know. We have put up a white board by the church staff mailboxes in the office to help communicate needs.

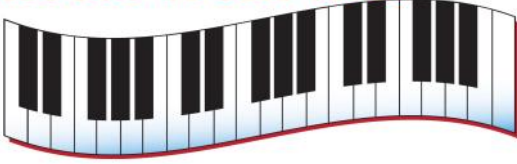

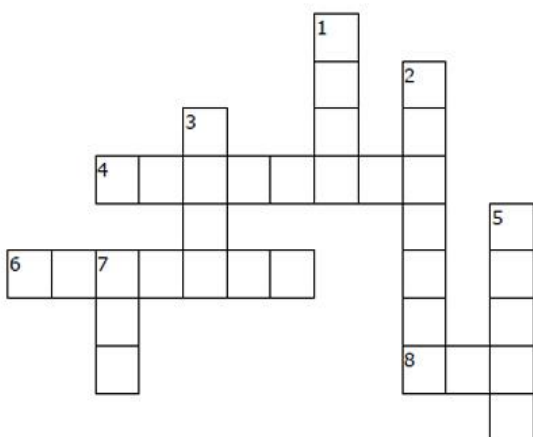

From the LSB, page xii: Commemorations

“Our churches teach that the remembrance of the saints is to be commended in order that we may imitate their faith and good works according to our calling.” Augsburg Confession 21

The Lutheran reformers understood that there was great benefit in remembering the saints whom God has given to His Church. The Apology of the Augsburg Confession (Article 21) gives three reasons for such honor. First, we thank God for giving faithful servants to His Church. Second, through such remembrance our faith is strengthened as we see the mercy that God extended to His saints of old. Third, these saints are examples by which we may imitate both their faith and their holy living according to our call in life.

The calendar of commemorations given here lists a number of men and women from both the Old and New Testaments and from the first 19 centuries of the Church’s life. Their defense of the fundamental beliefs of the Christian faith and/or their virtuous living have caused these individuals to stand out over time as persons worthy of recognition. In every case, the purpose of our remembrance is not that we honor these saints for their own sake, but as examples of those in whom the saving work of Jesus Christ has been made manifest to the glory of His holy name and to the praise of His grace and mercy.
